

ASSOCIATE ARTIST PROGRAMME



Working alongside Green Shoes Arts!

The **Associate Artist Programme** is a great opportunity for artists, arts professionals and students to develop projects alongside Green Shoes Arts. We are looking for **innovative** and **groundbreaking** ideas in the arts sector, including educational and community arts projects and arts performances or exhibitions. The programme is open for potential Associate Artists, which means you can approach us at any time.

If you have a great idea about an arts project or know about a funding source which you really want to get involved with, this programme is for you!

HOW THE PROGRAMME WORKS:



- Potential Associate Artist approaches Green Shoes Arts with an idea or funding source.
- Green Shoes Arts directors hold an initial consultation meeting with potential Associate Artist.
- Green Shoes Arts directors meet to discuss proposal. If successful, GSA decides on a supervisor for Associate Artist.
- GSA Supervisor and Associate Artist meet to determinate roles & responsibilities; draw up an agreement and decide on project's next steps and timeframe.
- Associate Artist supported by GSA to develop, deliver and evaluate the project.
- Green Shoes Arts directors and Associate Artist meet to discuss the partnership and develop next steps, if any.



WHAT GREEN SHOES ARTS OFFERS:

- The opportunity to work on your creative idea with the support of a well-established arts organisation.
- The opportunity to work alongside experienced project coordinators and arts facilitators.
- An introduction to working with Green Shoes Arts and guidance in safeguarding and health and safety.
- Green Shoes Arts infrastructure, including cover under GSA's insurance.
- Access to a wider professional network.
- Fundraising advice and support.



THE ASSOCIATE ARTIST WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Adopt Green Shoes Arts' values and aims.
- Act in accordance with Green Shoes Arts Policies, including Health & Safety, Children & Young People Safeguarding and Equal Opportunities.
- Provide GSA with a copy of its current CRB or undertake a check.
- Coordinate the project from the start under the supervision of his/her GSA line manager, including applying for funding.
- Organise staff (facilitators or actors) to deliver the practical aspect of the project. The Associate Artist might decide to take on this role himself.
- Achieve project's targets and outcomes.
- Constantly liaise with GSA supervisor regarding administration and the progress and development of the project.
- Monitor and evaluate the project.
